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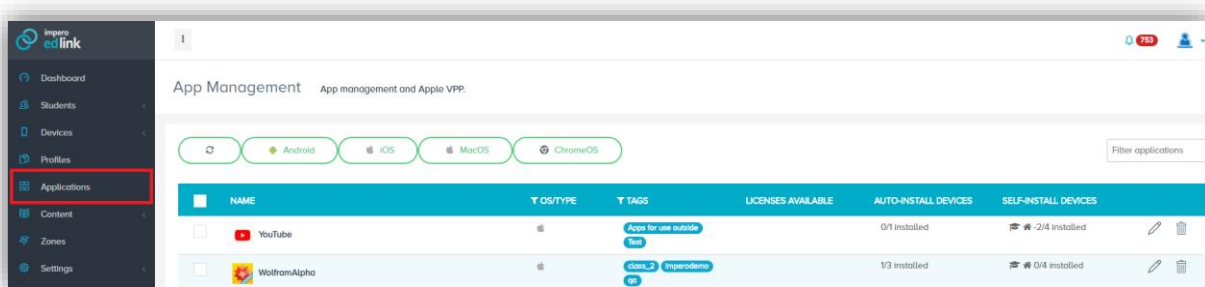
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Searching for ChromeOS Application

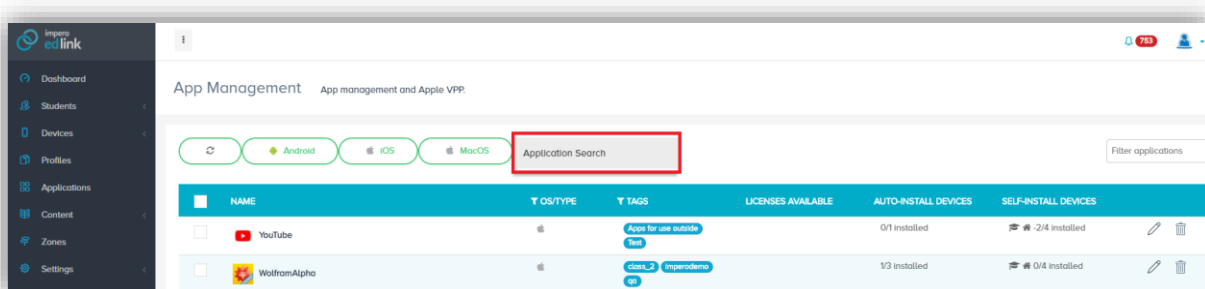
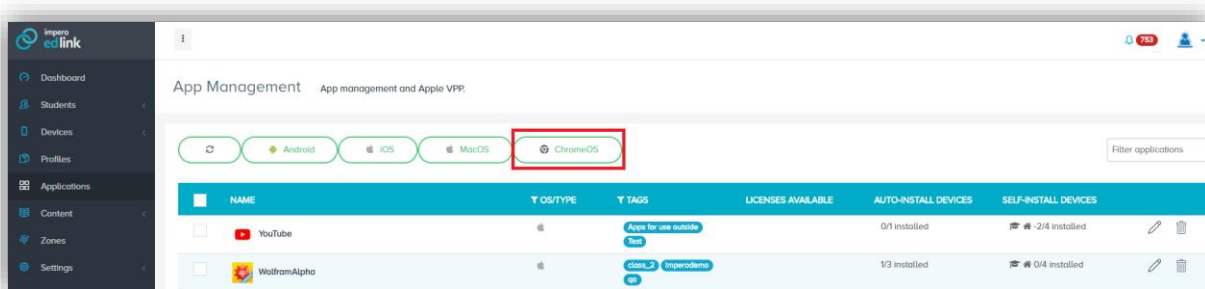
Steps to search for a ChromeOS Application.

Step 1 - Access the ChromeOS Application Search menu

Navigate to **Applications** menu option.

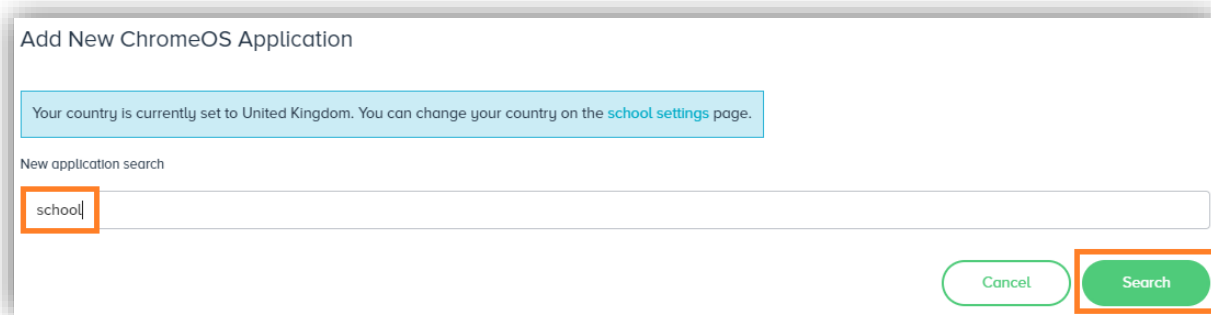


Select the **ChromeOS > Application Search** option.

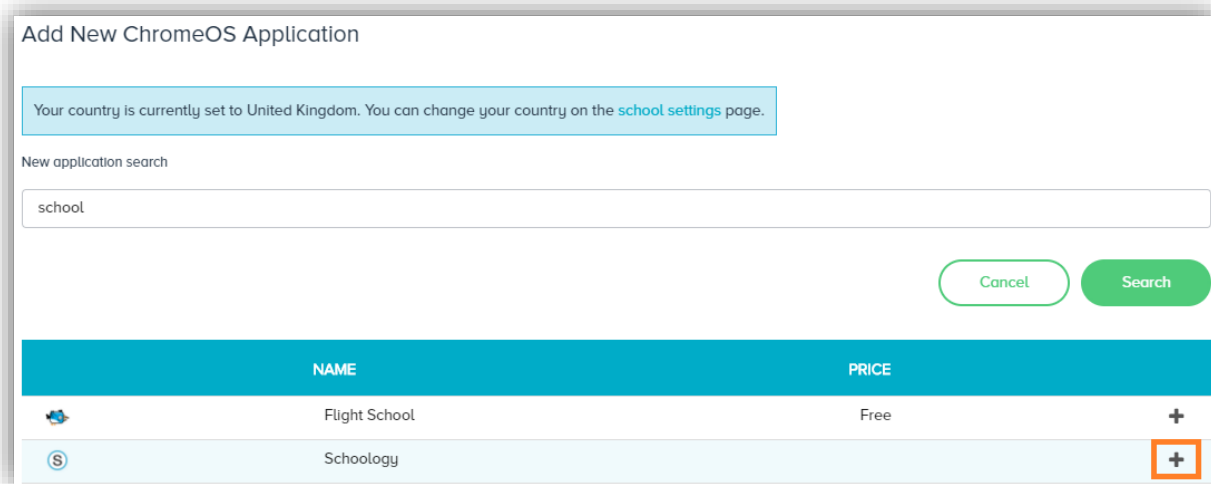


Step 2 - Search for a ChromeOS application

Specify search criteria and select the **Search** button.



Once search results return, select the add icon to select an application.



Add tags for ChromeOS application using Self-Install

Allows you to mass assign tags to a new ChromeOS application. At the same time you can assign the application to either home owned, school owned or both types of devices.

Using the self-install option will allow the user to download the specified application to the device in the Impero Edlink application.

Step 1 - Select settings for application

After you have searched for and found the new application you want to install, you will be given the option to mass assign tags to it. To do this, in the **Add these tags** input field, start entering the name of the first tag you want to assign, and then select a tag from the drop-down list. To add a brand new tag, type a tag name and press **Enter**.

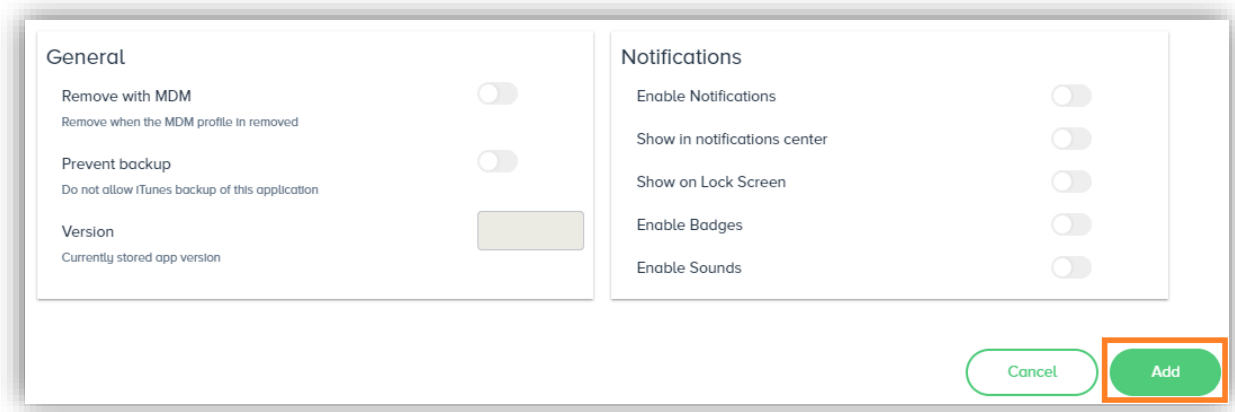

Deploy ChromeOS application using Self-Install

You may assign a new ChromeOS application to all school and home owned devices, both types of devices or neither.

Using the self-install option will allow the user to download the specified application to the device in the Impero Edlink application.

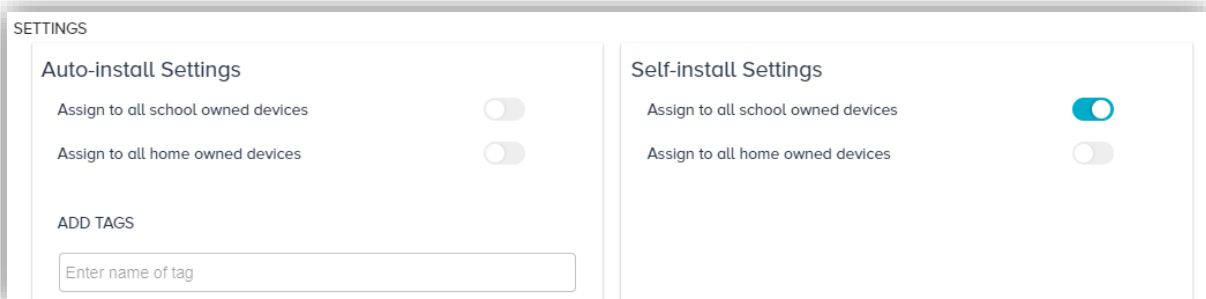
Step 1 - Select settings for application

After you have searched for and found the new application, you can use the Self-install Settings.

Under the Self-install Settings, you will be given the option to assign it to all school owned devices, all school owned devices, both or neither.

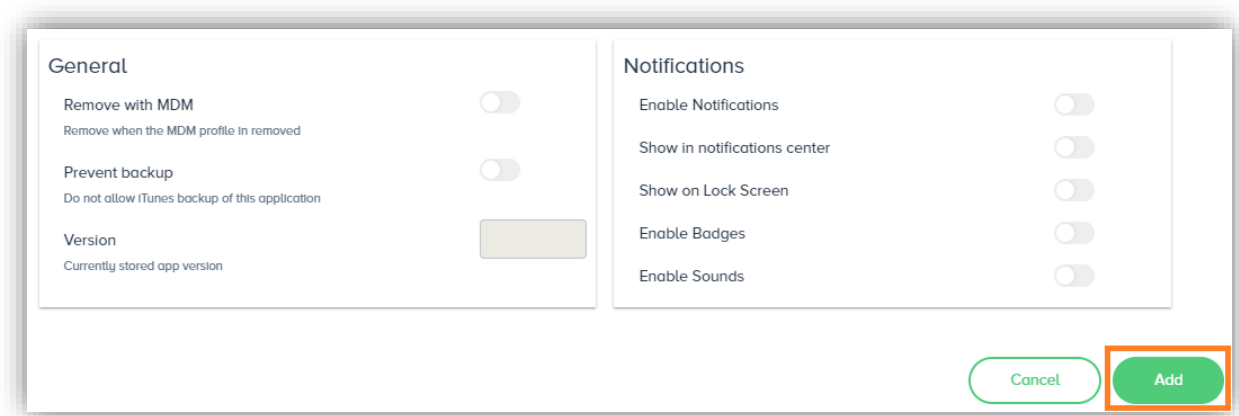
In the latter case, you will have to assign applications manually at a later stage.

In this example, the **Assign to all school owned devices** option is selected.



Step 2 - Save specified settings

Click on the **Add** button to save your settings.



The Application History Section

The Application History section shows the command history for a particular application. This also shows which devices the command was sent to as well as the status of the command. This is a great tool for troubleshooting if an application is not being deployed to a particular device.

An example for how an administrator can use this is shown in the last screen where the administrator can clearly see that command to remove the the Impero Edlink application from the specific device has been sent.

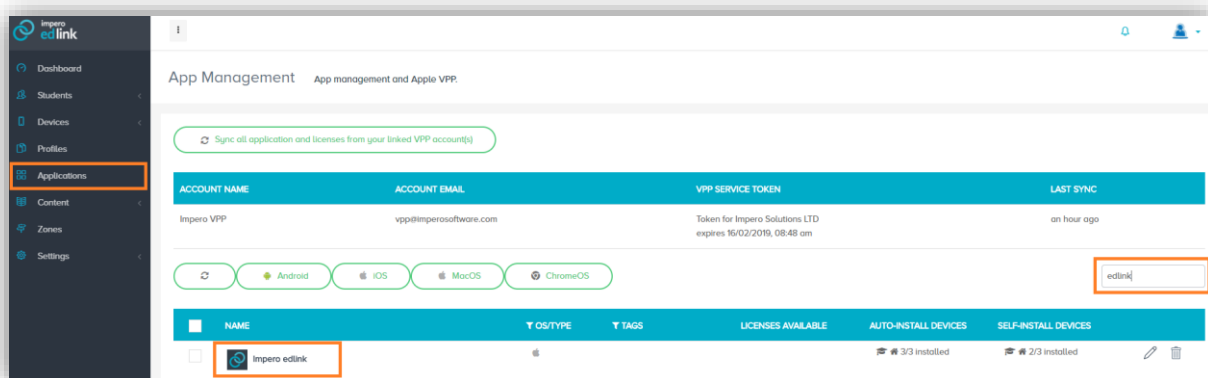
Where to find the Application History section:

Step 1 - Locate an application

Navigate to Applications menu option.

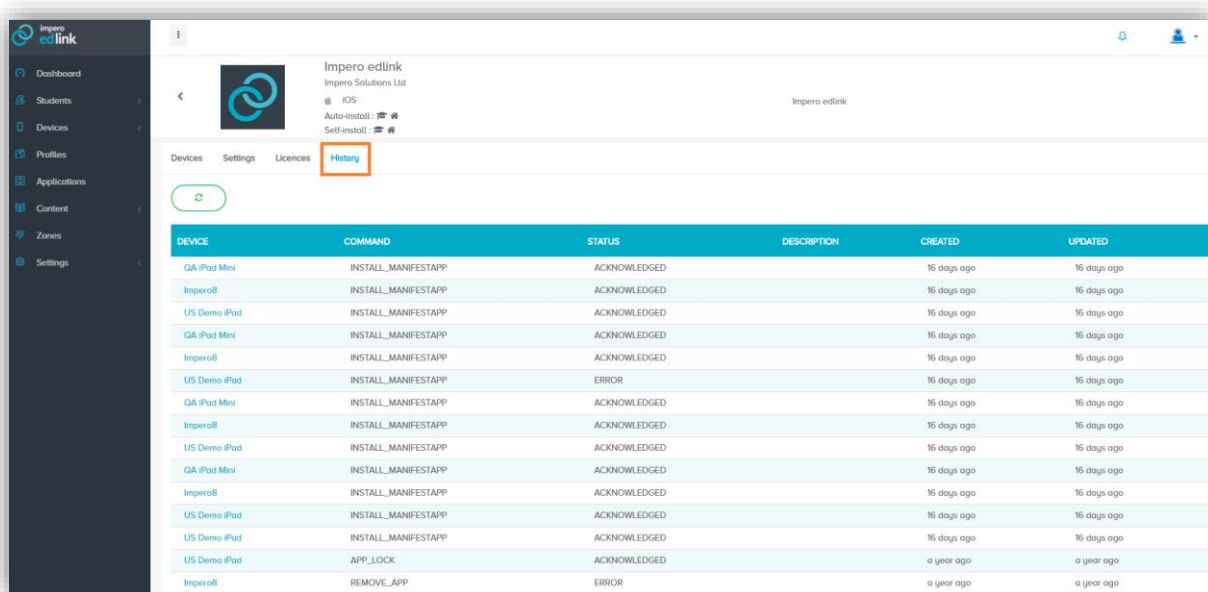
Search for an application.

Step 2 - Access Application History

Click the **History** tab and you will see the messages listed there per device.
